

Know where to go for care

Compare your options

Getting care at the place that may best fit your condition or situation may save you time and money compared to an emergency room (ER) visit.* If you believe you have a life-threatening condition, call 911 or go to the ER. For everything else, it may be best to contact your primary care provider (PCP) first. If seeing your PCP isn't possible, it's important to know your other care options, especially before heading to the ER.
